CAMRA

The Campaign for Real Ale has led one of the biggest consumer revolutions of all time. It has shown the brewers that not everyone wants the new-fangled processed beers that have, in many cases, been forced on to an unsuspecting public.

Since it was formed in 1971, CAMRA has fought to preserve and promote real ale. It has no financial support, except from its members, but it has managed to persuade a number of breweries and hundreds, maybe thousands, of pubs that the future lies in traditional beer. The battle is by no means won, however—nor will it be until almost every pub in Britain serves the real thing.

London is a good example of what needs to be done. More than six out of every seven pubs in the capital serve nothing but pressurised or processed beers—an appalling state of affairs for one of the country's greatest showpieces.

More than 130 CAMRA branches throughout Britain—twelve of them in Greater London—organise the Campaign at a local level by keeping in touch with, encouraging and opposing breweries and pubs. Their meetings and socials are open to all members and some of them organise beer exhibitions and trips to breweries to fit in with their campaigning activities.

CAMRA publishes an annual guide to the best of Britain's real ale pubs.
